Well done, Selena!

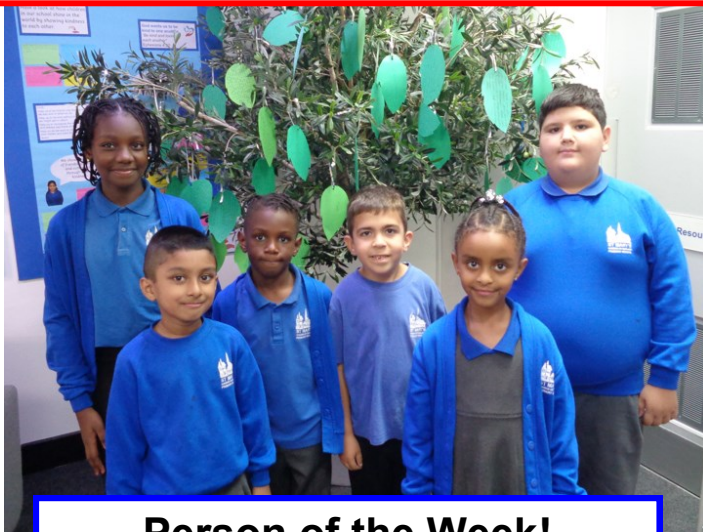
Our Prayer of the week...
