Y4 Science: Hampstead Heath workshop

On Friday last week, Year 4 visited the Hampstead Heath Education Centre as part of their 'living things and their habitats' Science topic. They learned how scientists classify living things based on their characteristics, such as how many legs they have, or if they have wings. They also had the opportunity to hunt for invertebrates in the park's secret garden and to try pond dipping to see what living things they could find in the water, identifying what they had found along the way.
